## What are Women's SUD Specialty Programs?

These programs understand the unique substance use and recovery needs of women, pregnant women, women with children, and primary caregivers to children. Pregnant and parenting women are priority for admission to treatment. Clinicians, recovery coaches, and case managers provide services to promote success and enhance the individual's recovery journey.

The program is available to individuals who are uninsured, have Medicaid or Healthy Michigan Plan, and for all levels of care (Withdrawal Management and Residential IOP, and OP).

### Programming includes:

- Referral, resources, and coordination for prenatal care
- Referral, resources, and coordination for immunizations for mom mother child
- Transportation
- Childcare for any existing children
- Family Support
- Parenting Classes
- Behavioral health services for children
- Full array of behavioral health services for pregnant women and women with children.
  - Case Management (Linkage to WIC and other ancillary services)
  - Individual, group, and family therapy
  - Peer recovery coach services
- Existing children can accompany

## Program Types

**CLEARVIEW-RESIDENTIAL:** Sacred Heart Clearview is an all-female program that allows the needs of women to be addressed without distractions. The withdrawal management program is medically managed, so it is safe for women and pregnant women. This residential program has a short-term program that addresses the unique needs of women, women with children, and pregnant women, in a safe, comfortable, and trusting environment. Curriculum and programming are set to focus on needs specific to women and women with children, including space/care for children while the mother attends programming.

**PROJECT RECOVERY INTENSIVE FOR MOTHERS (PRISM):** PRISM is a comprehensive and intensive substance use program designed to assist mothers and pregnant women in the development and maintenance of a substance-free lifestyle. Engagement in this programs equips women with the necessary skills, education, and resources needed to generate health and rewarding relationships with their children.



**NEONATAL:** Women in the program are given a case manager, outreach specialist, and hospital patient navigator. They assist with making appointments and other arrangements needed. Care is delivered in a collaborative, non-punitive, therapeutic manner to support women who seek treatment. It focuses on the best interests of the woman. Collaboration occurs between other service-providing agencies such as The Department of Corrections Office, Obstetrician (hospital), and the Children's Services Administration.

**ENHANCED TREATMENT SERVICES:** The program coordinates wrap-around services to support pregnant and parenting women with a substance use disorder (SUD). It is designed to eliminate as many potential barriers as possible to maximize women's chances for successful recovery. Care is delivered in collaborative, non-punitive, therapeutic manner that supports women who seek treatment and focuses on the best interests of women.
